*I am particularly proud of my involvement with the Collin County Bench/Bar Conference and Foundation. With the help of two other attorneys, I started the project in 1994 as a vehicle for improving relations between the judiciary and attorneys in our county. Initially a one-day event with 30 participants, the conference has grown to a three-day conference with an attendance of over 150 lawyers and judges. In 1996, along with Judge Curt B. Henderson and Susan Z Wright, I formed the Collin County Bench/Bar Foundation, a non-profit corporation to manage the conference and to provide an opportunity for attorneys and judges to donate money for philanthropic and charitable causes. The Collin County Bench/Bar Foundation also sponsors an ethics conference each year to address legal ethics and in 2000 is awarding scholarships to Collin County students, one of which will be given in my name. Although a fledgling organization, we now have approximately 50 fellows who have pledged funds and we are growing continually. I served as co-chair of the Foundation for three years and still serve on the board.
